This can be done by utilizing the sign up sheets that get posted on the club bulletin board (near the marina restrooms), through e-mail to the club web site, or in person with any Board Member. Guests are always welcome, but a nominal fee will apply to cover the cost of the event.

May 19th @ 14:00 – Tailgate Party. Celebrate spring commissioning with your marina neighbors over some pizza provided by the club. BYOB (Beverage) & BYOLC (Lawn Chair).

May 27th @ 18:00 – All American Picnic. The club provides traditional grill fare (hamburgers and hot dogs) as we celebrate the Memorial Day weekend. Members are asked to bring a dessert to pass.

Handicapping & Scoring

Handicaps are assigned using the Portsmouth system with some local adjustments. Scoring is done using a low-points system. Formal protests are discouraged.
