FLYC 2007 Race Results

Last year the dominant theme within the FLYC racing fleet was the high standard of sportsmanship exhibited by all of the skippers and crews. I am happy to report that this long-standing tradition for the FLYC continued. The FLYC has been, and continues to be, one of the best havens for civilized competition in the sailing world.

This is not to say that the competition is not keen or intense. It is. While scores between the top three boats were spread out more than in recent years, the differences between boats in the rest of the fleet have tightened up noticeably. There are also more boats coming out to race each week, which keeps things interesting and engaging.

This year's weather also proved to be cooperative, providing us with good winds on most weekends and an extended season with lovely, warm weather that extended well into October.

Special thanks to all those who helped with race marks and to those who acted as substitute race committee on a number of weekends when I was unable to enjoy the great sailing with the rest of the fleet. As always, this demonstrates the caliber of fine sailors in the FLYC who are always willing to lend a hand.

The year was not without its trials. The club suffered a significant setback in late July when the Schuyler County Deputy Sheriff discovered an error in the paperwork for the club's floating mark permit while investigating a complaint. The club was ordered to remove the race marks as quickly as possible. Many thanks to Terry Stewart and his colleagues in the New York State Police Scuba Diving Unit! These marks come out a whole lot harder than they go in!

Soon it will be time to begin planning for the 2008 season. If you have comments, critiques or suggestions, please share them with me. About FLYC Racing The FLYC has an active racing program. This program consists of the following:

- Summer Series. A series of 8 races held on Saturdays throughout the summer. These are "typical" club races (about 90 minutes each) that utilize seasonal race marks placed in the lake by the FLYC each spring. These races are open to all, but only club members are eligible for prizes and awards. The best 6 of the 8 races are used for scoring purposes.
- Commodore's Race to Lodi. An annual event typically held in late July or early August. This is a race with special provisions for cruisers and the logistical realities of a club "rendezvous.

About FLYC Cruising

The FLYC is actively developing a cruising program to compliment its racing activities.

- FLYC Mystery Cruise. New in 2006, this event was well received. Cruisers were told to provision for a weekend and then met at the marina on Saturday morning before embarking on a trip to a mystery destination
- FLYC Winery Cruise. New in 2007, this event shows the promise of becoming an annual tradition. An overnight cruise from Watkins Glen to the Miles Winery proved to be popular and successful this year, with good breezes and excellent wine at our destination of choice.
