### From the Rear Commodore

All of you know that you can be penalized during a race for a violation of the racing rules. Determining how the rules are interpreted or what rule takes precedence is the responsibility of the race committee. In general, the race committee is authorized to publish the sailing instructions, run the race and produce the results. The sailing instructions include a description of the marks, the starting and finishing lines and the course to be sailed around the marks. Each sailor must make his own attempt to comply with the rules during the race to the best of his ability.



If you break a "when boats meet" rule, you may exonerate yourself (clear the penalty) by sailing clear of other boats as soon as possible and make two turns in the same direction including two tacks and two gybes. If your boat (including crew and equipment) touches a mark, you may exonerate yourself by sailing clear of the other boats and completing one turn consisting of a tack and a gybe in one direction. This may seem to add a gentlemanly air to the spirit of racing but of course, human nature being what it is, the race committee will have the final say. (Unless you appeal the race committee's decision to a National Authority and in this case the appeal only on a question of interpretation of procedures not on the facts of the case established by the race committee.)

I hope to encourage some healthy debate in the course of our racing season both for the fun of it and to sharpen all of our knowledge of the rules of sailboat racing.

### About FLYC Racing

All times indicate the beginning of the skippers' meeting prior to the race. This meeting is mandatory for anyone wishing to compete. Each boat must have at least one representative at this meeting.

### **Early Bird Race**

Also known as the "Rig Tuner's Regatta," this race is held in the pre-season to allow skippers to blow the cobwebs out of their boats and crew and tune up for the coming season.

#### **FLYC Summer Series**

This is a series of ten races held on weekends in June through September and is used to determine the club champion each year. Scoring is done per USSA PHRF handicapping with some slight modifications to allow for "golfstyle" adjustments to keep things competitive.

### **FLYC Guest Race**

*A* one-time race typically held sometime during the summer if the schedule looks too empty.

### **FLYC Race to Lodi**

The club's signature event held in late July or early August. It consists of a one-way race of approximately 14 nautical miles from Watkins Glen to Lodi State Marine Park. A beach party usually follows.

#### **Grape Harvest Race**

A way to enjoy the fall foliage and get one last race in before the long winter.

#### **Entry Fees**

There are no race entry fees for FLYC members.

#### Handicapping & Scoring

Handicaps are assigned using the PHRF system with some local adjustments. Scoring is done using the timeon-distance calculations.

# FLYC Obituary – Tony Ruiz (1951-2013)

It is with much sadness that we must post yet another obituary for one of our FLYC members. Tony was active in our club and served as the Chairman for the Cruising Committee a few years back. As stated in the obituary below, he will be missed by many. Obituary courtesy of Royce-Chedzoy Funeral Home. – Ed.

BURDETT, NY: Tony Ruiz, 61, died unexpectedly of a heart attack on February 21, 2013, at his home.

Born Segundo Antonio Ruiz Quintanilla on July 26, 1951 in Hamburg, Germany to the late Margarete Bielefeldt and Segundo Ruiz Quintanilla, Tony spent his early years in Germany, where he was an avid handball and soccer player and took care of racehorses. He loved photography and later became a supporter of the Arts.

Tony met his future wife, Christa Wolf, in 1978, when they were colleagues at the University of Konstanz in Baden-Württemberg, Germany. The two lived in Berlin, Germany for ten years before moving to Ithaca in 1989. They were married in 2000 and moved to Burdett in 2001.

Tony received his undergraduate degree from the University of Hamburg, Germany and his Ph.D. in psychology in 1983 from the University of Technology in Berlin, Germany, where he was also an Associate Professor in the Department of Work & Organizational Psychology. He went on to hold visiting research professor positions at the University of Oklahoma; Osaka University, Japan; University of Ghent, Belgium; and the Aarhus Business School in Denmark. Tony was a Visiting Professor and Senior Research Associate at Cornell University from 1990-2008 and, most recently, a Research Specialist at the University of New Hampshire's Hunter College Institute on Disability. Throughout his career, he published numerous scholarly articles on organizational behavior, human resource management and disability statistics.



Tony could often be found tending his vineyards and bees on the beautiful land overlooking Seneca Lake, where he and Christa restored a farmhouse and barn. The two spent many enjoyable hours sailing, swimming and walking in the fields and woods. During the last year of his life, Tony stoically endured and, with the loving support of Christa, worked hard to overcome the physical and other challenges presented by longstanding spinal injuries.

Tony is survived by his beloved wife and partner of 34 years, Christa Wolf; a brother, Manuel Ruiz; his stepdaughters, Christina and Kati; and by a large community of friends and colleagues. Tony will be remembered for his kindness, mentorship, keen intellect and delight in life.
