Race Committee Comments

Mother Nature has had a hard time "picking a lane" this Spring. Water levels throughout Upstate NY have been beyond excessive. Despite a below-normal snowpack, the late season snows combined with heavy and broad-based rainfall put Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence River and the Erie Canal over their banks. Due to extreme flooding in Quebec and Eastern Ontario (combined with President Obama having signed a treaty giving control of the St. Lawrence's level to the Canadian government) the gates on the St. Lawrence were kept closed, backing up the River into the Lake and the Lake backing up into the Canal and

the Canal into our Finger Lakes. I have dealers in Alexandria Bay whose stores, offices and repair shops are 8-10" underwater. The town of Chaumont (where another of my dealers' brand new store was underwater) had calls out for residents to come and fill sandbags day after day. Sodus Point reminded me of the Parishes south of New Orleans when the Mississippi was flooding. Correspondingly, not too many have been able to make it out even to remember which strings to pull when. Racing will get underway slowly, I'm sure.

In the meantime (and I mean over the winter, as well) did you read any books on racing techniques? How about the North U course on Sail Trim or on Racing Tactics? Both of these courses come with both a CD and a textbook (for those, like me, who still like a book in their hands where one can flip back and forth faster than the laptop can scroll).

Did you attend any seminars over the winter. North, UK, Quantum, all support these talks with hardcore sailors and sailmakers (and not always tacticians and helmsmen) giving out more than product spiels.

How many racing videos did you watch over the winter? Youtube is overflowing with them. Yeah, I get it... it can be a bit depressing to watch all these folks in Key West, or Antigua, or Charleston for Race Weeks. Damn it! I had friends sailing in each of those regattas and put myself through the misery of watching them in the evening as the daily results were posted along with the videos. But in the end, there was a lot to be learned (some of it from their mistakes). And then following up with them when they returned with their tans, getting their own experiences and what they learned.

How about your physical conditioning? We all figure that we can "play our way into shape" during the course of the season, but getting to it, even now, can help grind that winch and get that jib in faster, can help avoid that loss of balance, slowing down your movement from one rail to the other during a tack, and can probably help avoid that sore and stiff back after one of our typical Seneca Lake blustery days. **Sailing Fitness Optis to the America's Cup** (available from Annapolis Performance Sailing {apsltd.com}) is a CD especially aimed at core strength, balance and upper body flexibility for sailors.

As of the time of this writing, I don't know whether we'll have enough (if any) folks interested in a Rust Remover Race, but the season will be starting in early June, aiming for 8 races for the season's series, the **Commodore's Race**, the **Grape Harvest Race** and the **Gear Buster** in October, letting us know what will need to be replaced or repaired over the winter.

I look forward to seeing you all at the Flagpole.

of Bridge O-14 (Bridge Street) from its normal of 26.5 feet to 21.5 feet, still higher than the governing height of 21 feet for the Eastern Erie Canal and Oswego Canal.

Mariners are advised to check with their destination marina on Lake Ontario or the St. Lawrence River to ensure that dockage is still available. The 48-hour limit for mooring on canal walls is waived on the entire Oswego Canal and on the Erie Canal in Brewerton for those mariners who need more time to make other docking arrangements.

Harmful Algal Bloom Notifications

DEC's harmful algal bloom (HABs) notification season starts today. The <u>HABs Notifications webpage</u> will be updated every Friday through the fall, and a link and the number of waterbodies with blooms will be included in every *MakingWaves*.


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This week, **9** waterbodies were added to the <u>notification list</u>. There are currently **9** waterbodies with blooms on the list.

New Brochure and Program Guide Available

To help educate the public about HABs, DEC released a <u>new brochure</u> (PDF, 415 KB) explaining how to detect, avoid and report HABs, as well as the health risks of HABs. DEC has also released a new <u>Program Guide</u> (PDF, 1.8 MB) that details how the DEC HABs Program works with partners to identify, track and report HABs throughout the state, and communicate health risks to the public.

Avoid and Report Suspected Blooms



Because waterbodies may have HABs that have not been reported to DEC, we recommend avoiding contact with floating mats, scum and discolored water.

If you suspect you have seen a HAB, or you, your family, or pet has been in contact with a HAB, please follow the instructions for reporting a bloom to DEC. If you see it, avoid it and report it!

VHS Linked to Cayuga Lake Fish Kill

Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS) has been connected to a fish kill involving thousands of round gobies in Cayuga Lake, the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) announced today. VHS can cause hemorrhaging of fish tissue, including internal organs, and can cause the death of infected fish. It does not pose any threat to human health.

Cornell University confirmed VHS was present in fish samples collected by DEC on May 12. VHS is a deadly and persistent virus of fresh and saltwater fish that has been causing disease issues in the Great Lakes and connected waters since 2003. It was first documented in New York in 2006. VHS has not been linked to a fish kill in the Finger Lakes in almost a decade and this is the first discovery of the presence of this virus in Cayuga Lake.

VHS is currently responsible for an ongoing fish kill in Lake St. Claire in Michigan and western Lake Erie.

Water temperatures have been optimal for the virus this spring as it replicates prominently in water temperatures between 50° and 58° F. Mortalities usually continue until the water warms above that range. VHS can be spread through a variety of means, including the moving of potentially infected fish from one waterbody to another. This can be done by stocking or the use of bait fish.

DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said, "Anglers play a key role in preventing the spread of VHS. We encourage anglers to vigilantly follow the regulations prohibiting the movement of baitfish and other fish between waters to protect New York's high quality fishing."

To help prevent the spread of VHS, anglers and boaters should:

- follow <u>baitfish regulations</u> developed to prevent the spread of harmful fish diseases;
- only release baitfish into the waterbody it was taken from;
- not discard unused bait purchased commercially into any body of water;
- not move fish from one water body to another;
- not dispose of fish carcasses or by-products in any body of water; and
- <u>Inspect, Drain and Dry and Disinfect</u> boats and gear before moving to another water.

DEC routinely collects and tests fish from approximately 30 waters annually to screen for VHS and other harmful diseases. People can help DEC monitor the health of New York's fish populations by reporting any large number of dead or dying fish (usually 100 or more) to the nearest DEC regional office (ask for the Bureau of Fisheries) or the Rome Fish Disease Control Unit at (315) 337-0910.


