MAY 31, 2020 – OK, we in the Southern Tier are officially in Phase 2 of the Governor's Reopening NY as of June 1st. This affects offices, real estate, essential and some in-store retail, vehicle sales, leases, and rentals, retail rental, repair and cleaning, commercial building management as well as hair salons and barbershops. It changes NOTHING for our marina, including the restaurant. Therefore, all things are remaining the same for the marina, including restrictions and use of face masks. I see no change in our approach going forward at this point. Onward to Phase 3.


Above: A home in the harbour since 1831; Royal Irish Yacht Club, Ireland.


