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# Rear Commodore's Comments

Greetings everyone and happy spring! After a long winter and a slow-to-start spring it's great to see boats and sailors getting ready for another season of racing and other sailing adventures. To that extent, this month's installment will highlight the following topics: race communications, some basic racing information, an invitation to new contestants and a friendly reminder for volunteers to help out on

race days.

I will be using REMIND, a free texting service for disseminating race information. Instead of cumbersome group texts, this method allows anyone to sign up (to receive messages) by texting a code to a phone number. I will be using REMIND messages: to post a reminder a few days before each race, when a race is delayed, rescheduled, or cancelled, when we will be using "make-up race" dates and other racing related announcements.

There are two methods for signing up to receive REMIND messages, by installing the app or just signing up to receive REMIND text messages on your phone (instructions below). *You do **NOT** need to download their app to receive messages on your phone.*

When you first sign up to the group (FLYC 2021 Racing), your first REMIND text message may indicate there are missed messages (sent before signing up) and to receive them you'll need the app. Don't bother, you didn't miss a thing. Messages posted prior to this publication were "test" messages and contain no useful information. REMIND can also be used to send pictures or other files. If this is done, a description of what the file is will be in the message.

Here is the info for joining the FLYC 2021 Racing REMIND group:

- Text the message @gk93e3 to the number 81010.
- If you're having trouble with 81010, try texting @gk93e3 to (574) 807-6973.
- Reply text @LEAVE to unsubscribe.

On the day of each race there will be a skippers' meeting at the flagpole at 13:00 with the start horn at 13:45. Race radio communications will be via VHF channel 69.

Countdown to start signals:

- T-Minus 10 minutes: Radio announcement.
- T-Minus 5 minutes: horn
- T-Minus 1 minute: horn
- START: horn

Our start/finish line is shown in the overhead diagram below.



The start line is a contiguous line extending westward from the light tower end of the outer seawall to where it intersects a line extending north from the old "fuel dock" - just east of the restaurant and behind the former treatment plant site (see diagram below).

Racers are encouraged to keep a stopwatch time of their own. An easy method is to use a cell phone timer app. There are a wide variety of free sailing and racing apps that provide a host of useful features beyond elapsed time, including speed, track recording and compass heading. I use Boatspeed (free on Google play store). When crossing the finish line skippers should radio the committee boat and/or sound your horn (you should have one on board for safety). We will affirm your transmission and record your time. Each skipper should be tracking their own time as a backup in the event of missed communications or other unforeseeable issues.

Afterwards, join us for post race analysis and hors d'oeuvres at the flagpole. Lynne McGinnis has kindly offered to provision us for the post Rust Removal Race on May 29th. Thanks to Lynne for getting the ball rolling this season. If you would like to provision future post-race gatherings, be sure to let me know and I will sign you up. Racers, please consult the calendar in this newsletter for summer series and other race dates.

Debates may rage elsewhere, but I trust we can all agree that racing is best when there are more contestants. If you are new to racing, please consider joining us for some fun, comradery and best of all, a great excuse to be on the water. Hesitant to enter your own vessel? Consider crewing to get your sea legs. We are always looking to expand the fleet and crewing is a great introduction to racing. If you're interested or know of any interested skippers (or crew), please pass the word and invite them to join in. Interested parties should join us at the flagpole at 13:00 on race days.

And lastly, we are always looking for volunteers to help out with setting and retrieving marks. Many hands make light work. If you can spare a little time, we could really use your

assistance. Please contact me through REMIND or email me via [racechair@flyc.us](mailto:racechair@flyc.us). Your assistance is greatly appreciated!

Hope to see you on the water soon.







# Editor's Corner

## Bermuda Update

I was expecting to write a very different column in this issue, but on Thursday evening, May 13<sup>th</sup>, the Marion-Bermuda Race Committee announced that the 2021 race had been cancelled. This despite the facts that Bermuda covid cases were declining and that the island was coming out of its late-April lockdown. It appears that the driving factor was the CDC's reclassification of Bermuda as a "very high risk" travel destination.

Now what? We had everything ready. To say that my crew and I were disappointed would be a gross understatement.

Other competitors appear to have been caught equally off-guard. There were some FaceBook posts from other boats looking to see if anyone was interested in making the trip anyway. *Tomfoolery's* crew expressed interest, but we really needed a good shakedown of both the boat and the crew before we could commit.

Enter the Essex Yacht Club of Essex, CT. We were put in touch with Bill Gunther who was organizing the 69<sup>th</sup> running of the Sam Wetherill Memorial Race from Saybrook, CT to Martha's Vineyard and back, with a leg through the North Atlantic around the bottom of Block Island. This would be a 140 nm race. Bill offered to help us in any way possible to get registered for the race, which would be starting the following Friday on May 21<sup>st</sup>. After discussing it with my crew, we decided to go for it.

One detail: We had to launch the boat, commission her, and get her to Essex within four days.

Launch times are constrained to narrow windows around high tide in the Hudson River. We were already scheduled to launch later in the week, so it took a few phone calls to confirm that we could launch first thing on Tuesday morning, and on Monday afternoon, Jim McGinnis, Mike Crouse, Katie Alley, and I drove out to Coeymans Landing to begin preparing for launch. Because of tidal constraints, our objective was to do as much as possible to get *Tomfoolery* ready for departure prior to launch. I can state with great confidence that it is much easier to provision a boat from the dock than it is to haul a week's worth of food and supplies up a 10-foot ladder! We slept well that night!

Boatyard manager, Eric, showed up right on schedule on Tuesday morning and, since he had hung us in the travelift slings the afternoon before, we were in the water and tied to the dock for final commissioning within 20 minutes. Following some final system checks, we were underway down the Hudson River within 90 minutes. 214 nm, 45 hours, and a few adventures later (which I'm sure you will hear about), we arrived in Essex, CT during the early dawn hours of Thursday, May 20<sup>th</sup>.

After napping for a few hours, the Essex Yacht Club staff directed us to a complimentary slip where we could stay prior to the race. We were treated like celebrities, with introductions along the lines of, "This is the crew of *Tomfoolery*, who traveled all the way from Watkins Glen to race with us!"

Andrea Johnson joined us later that Thursday, after driving my van to Essex so that we would all have a ride home after the race. We attended the skippers' meeting and spent time reviewing the race instructions and formulating our strategy. Tides, we were told, would be the key. Several of the club's "old salts" shared a great deal of local knowledge with us that proved to be invaluable.

I won't bore you with the details of the race here. There's plenty to tell and that will be saved for longer articles in the future. Tides did turn out to be a major factor, as did some fickle winds. (We spent a total of almost 6 hours becalmed at various stages of the race.) We finished well – very well considering the level of competition we were facing. (Again, a story unto itself for another time.)

What's next? We'll return in mid-June to do some serious cruising in New England. We've had recommendations from many of the locals giving us a long list of places that are "must see," and since we're in the area, we'll take advantage of that situation.
